Phonic Screening and Writing Moderation

This week, children in Year 1 across the country have been completing their Phonics Screening tests, which have tested our children on 40 phonetically decodable words. The children have been a credit and have shown off their great reading skills. Although we await the pass mark, I am confident that we have done well as a school yet again. I would like to thank the infant staff, all of whom work very hard teaching your children to read and of course to yourselves who support the children so well at home.

We have also been selected this year for Year 6 writing moderation where a representative of Lancashire County Council checks and qualifies our writing assessments. Not only were all of our assessments accurate but the assessor was also incredibly impressed with the progress that she saw and commended the wonderful love of writing that the children clearly have from their work. 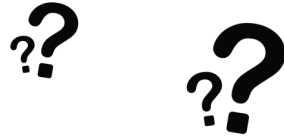
